- A Microsoft online communication and collaboration platform
- Combines chat, video meetings, and file storage
- Create news, posts, and assignments for students
- Collaborate on documents via Teams and supporting Microsoft products

The username is your student number followed by your password.



  - Password reset will be prompted when you login

# Accessing Teams through Office 365





## Your Team Home Page


